What does recycled mean?

Recycled means that a product is made all or in part from a material that was once something else.

How does recycling work?

Material is collected, re-manufactured and sold as another product.

How do I recycle?

Separate your paper, plastic and cardboard from your regular household garbage and drop it off at Byram Public Works.

What are the benefits of recycling?

Recycling helps reduce pollution, conserve materials, save energy, create jobs and reduce landfill waste.

Are there special bins or bags to use?

No, the recyclables can be brought in any container, bag, or box.

What will it cost me to recycle?

Nothing other than time and effort.

Does the city make a profit?

Starting out, no. Future plans do include monthly rebates that will be reinvested in the city.

Does everyone have to participate?

No, the service is optional.

What happens to the items after I drop them off?

They are picked up and hauled to an approved recycling facility where they are processed.

What can I do with the items not accepted?

Contact City Hall for more information on disposal options.

Is recycling worth my time?

Only you can answer this question. We say YES!

Do I need to wash the container?

No, it just needs to be free of excess amounts of food waste.

I'm interested, do I need to sign up?

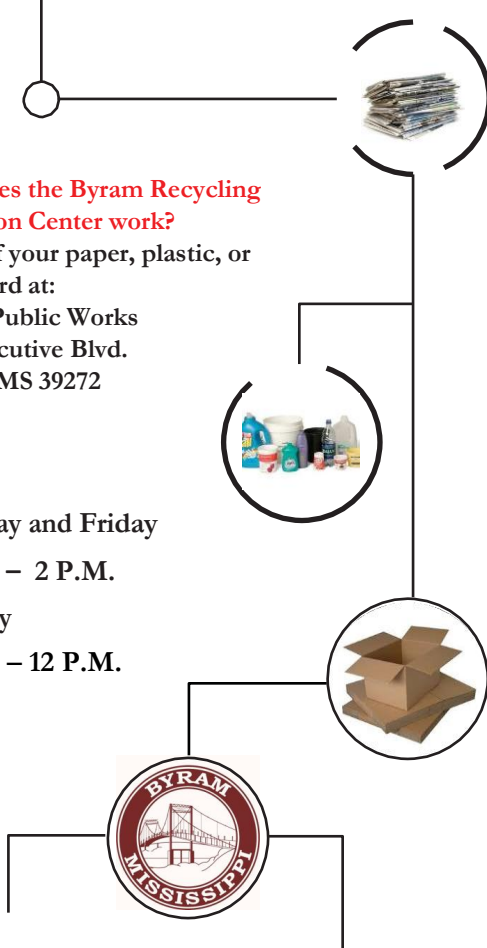
